Introduction

Before we get on with the syllabus and start getting down to the Nitti Gritty as it were, I would like to give you an idea as to why I have developed this course and why it is so important. Especially in these coming days with the apostasy and great falling away so close at hand.

(2Ti 4:1-5 I charge thee in the sight of God, and of Christ Jesus, who shall judge the quick and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom; (2) preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching. (3) For the time will come when they will not endure the sound doctrine; but, having itching ears, will heap to themselves teachers after their own lusts; (4) and will turn away their ears from the truth, and turn aside unto fables. (5) But be thou sober in all things, suffer hardship, do the work of an evangelist, fulfil thy ministry. Revised Version)

I have been going to church now for 25 years and I didn't become a believer until I was well into adulthood. I point this out to indicate that I was not brought up with any preconceptions as what behaviour in a church should be like, I assumed that all church goers

were the same; same beliefs and practices etc.... I did however, in contrast, become heavily involved in the occult as a teenager, the details of which need not be discussed in depth here but mentioned, again, to let the reader know that I have had extensive experience outside of Christianity and have been involved with many occultic and New Age teachings and practices before becoming a believer. I experimented heavily in many practices that can readily be seen as anti-Christian and definitely not in any way creating accessibility to the biblical God, but certain and easy access to the god of this world, Satan.

Why is it important that I mention this?

It is important because as time has gone on I have seen so many changes in the teachings of many that indicate quite clearly that a large amount of the practices I had repented of and left behind were once again rearing their ugly head. Not by me going back into the world of the occult but by simply going to church and reading "Christian" books and listening to some modern scholars.

Let me demonstrate what I mean: when I was not a believer I practiced the techniques I will list here, though

this list is not exhaustive, it is to give a general idea.

- Martial Arts (17 years)
- Yoga (from time to time)
- Transcendental Meditation
- Levitation
- Spell Casting
- Tarot
- Ouija Boards
- Divination
- Dowsing
- Pentagrams
- New Age
- Satanism
- Talisman

Along with these practices I belonged to "clubs" that practiced and examined many types of magic, and I do not mean the showman type of illusion and trickery, but real magic with supernatural content and unbiblical practices. To me these things were my way of dealing with life and the meaning of life – was God existential or in fact was I my own god? Was there a God at all and if so, who was he? Were we all our own gods living in our own universes that simply share the same space and if so can we actually control it through concentration, visualisation or prayer? I would practice many things to contact God and believe me when I say that many of these things provided amazing results and therefore I thought that I was on the right track. I would have out of body experiences whilst on LSD and for brief moments truly believe that I understood all things and the universe was apparent and totally comprehensible, and during these fleeting moments I would feel that I was

in fact in touch and one with god or that I was in reality god and in control of my own universe.

I had not only times of apparent clarity but also periods of fear and dread as the results of certain events, even to the point that I was afraid at times for my life.

But despite that, I continued on this path for many years. Going from one practice to another experimenting and moving on, if I had no joy from a particular practice I would move on to the next; it was a very experiential based belief system, one that allowed me to feel I was with god or at the very least *one* with him when I received an experience.

What I did not notice was the constant spiral of depression, drug taking, suicidal feelings and total lack of any morality in my life. I had no concern for others as I would happily break into people's homes or shops at night to provide for my addictions. My life had become a total mess with no real compass to give me direction other than the experiential one that I used which just led me further down the path of self-destruction.

As a result it was inevitable that I would end up in prison and of course this happened. So now you can see the position I approach this series from, I am approaching it as one who has been through the mill of occultism and New Age philosophy, someone who has experienced and understands the occult and its consequences.

So with this background firmly established let us get back to the reason I am developing this course.



What the Bible Says

It is interesting that when I became a believer and read the bible I found that all these practices I had been involved with were expressly forbidden¹ and as a result I vowed with the Lord to never do these things again as He calls them detestable and evil and most of all they go against the teachings of Scripture. Okay, you say; it is obvious as believers that we are to no longer do these things so why state the obvious? Quite simply, I am stating the obvious because most Christians are unaware of the amount of occultic and New Age practice the church has imported and accepted as Christian over the years. What was seen as practices to be avoided only a hundred years ago are now common place. What used to be prayed and warned against have now

become gifts many seek after. And what are many of these gifts?

Experiential ones!

Sadly as a result of the compromises made with the world the importation of these practices has cracked open the doors for other more radically wrong teachings to be accepted as biblical and accepted as a practical Christianity. Before we examine these practices let us spend some time in scripture examining what Adonai – the King of the Universe has to say and what He wants from us in regard to these observances.

Scriptures

Here is a fairly comprehensive but not by all means exhaustive list of scriptures detailing with the occult and its practice; I would recommend reading each one:

Please, before continuing, go back and read all these scriptures, in their context to gain a true biblical and God

centred view as to what He deems acceptable and detestable with these practices. This knowledge is important; as we progress it will become apparent that when examined in the light of Scripture, and what is known outside Scripture, we will begin to recognise what the occult truly is: then having recognised, an understanding of the deceptions will become much easier.

However, I am not stopping your study here. Before we carry on we are also going to look at the scriptures that relate to the issue of discernment and how important that is when examining Doctrine and the teachings of scholars and ministers in the church.

Discernment in Scripture

Just like the issue of the occult I will list a number of important scriptures relating to discernment, and again, like the previous scriptures I recommend that you go to the bible and read through them and test that I am not removing the scriptures from context. Context as you will see is the presiding and most important issue when we look at scripture.



So here are the next scriptures to study:

- But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men. (Matthew 15:9 KJV)
- And Jesus answered and said unto them, Take heed that no man deceive you. (Matthew 24:4 KJV)
- For many shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many. (Matthew 24:5 KJV)
- And many false prophets shall rise, and shall deceive many. (Matthew 24:11 KJV)
- For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect. (Matthew 24:24 KJV)
- And Jesus answering them began to say, Take heed lest any man deceive you: (Mark 13:5 KJV)
- For many shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many. (Mark 13:6 KJV)
- For they that are such serve not our Lord Jesus Christ, but their own belly; and by good words and fair speeches deceive the hearts of the simple. (Simple is better translated – Unlearned) (Romans 16:18 KJV)
- Let no man deceive himself. If any man among you seemeth to be wise in this world, let him become a fool, that he may be wise. (1 Corinthians 3:18 KJV)
- That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby

they lie in wait to deceive;
(Ephesians 4:14 KJV)

- Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience. (Ephesians 5:6 KJV)
- Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition; (2 Thessalonians 2:3 KJV)
- If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. (1 John 1:8 KJV)
- Little children, let no man deceive you: he that doeth righteousness is righteous, even as he is righteous.
- (1 John 3:7 KJV)

Context

What is context? And why is it so important?



Two excellent questions and I will endeavour to answer them simply and concisely.

First of all, context is the reading of scripture in the correct setting it was intended. Reading, not only what it says but to whom it was said and why. E.g. was the scripture written to Gentiles or Jews? Is the scripture relating to an event that is past, present or future? When reading other scriptures of the same type, how

do they relate, if they actually relate at all. In fact it is the relating of non-related scriptures taken out of context that is the cause of many of the deceptions prevalent today.

Secondly, its importance can be seen in the way we believe and are behaving as Christians, not only in church but in our lives daily.

Over the years I have spoken to various believers of many denominations and have heard many interpretations as to the meaning of the word "Discernment".

When I have asked about the understanding of the term 'discernment', I received some interesting responses:

- All believers have Discernment – Because we have Jesus we cannot be deceived, the Holy Spirit would not allow it.
- We are protected as believers so Discernment is really for the scholars who teach doctrine.
- Discernment helps us discover who is coming against the unity of the church.
- Discernment is the ability to recognise different demons that need to be cast out.
- I'm not sure.

These are just a few of the most common responses that reveal the individual understanding of what discernment is. The people I have spoken to come from a variety of church backgrounds including – Faith movement, Baptist, Methodist, Pentecostal and Messianic Fellowships amongst others.

What I have discovered is the teaching involved in the promotion of Biblical Discernment is either seriously lacking or completely misunderstood. Scripture throughout, warns of deceptions and being deceived, so to ignore those warnings and either refuse to teach them or to ignore them is leading the flock astray.

Discernment

Discernment is the ability to decide between truth and error, right and wrong. Discernment is the process of making careful distinctions and correct judgements in our thinking about truth, biblically. Biblical discernment is the ability to have an overview of Scripture to rightly divide the Word of truth (2 Tim 2:15), not taking Scripture out of context to support a personal belief.

First Thessalonians 5:21-22 teaches that it is the responsibility of every Christian to be discerning:

"But examine everything carefully; hold fast to that which is good; abstain from every form of evil."

John gives us further warning when he says:

"Do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world" (1 John 4:1 KJV).

According to the Scripture, discernment is not optional for the believer - it is a requirement.

Not having the ability to distinguish between truth and error is leaving believers open to all manner of false

doctrines and acceptance of false teachers. False teaching then leads to an unbiblical mind-set, which results in unfruitful and disobedient living - a recipe for compromise and spiritual disaster.

Unfortunately, discernment is an area where most Christians stumble. They exhibit little ability to measure the things they are taught compared to the infallible standard of God's Word, and they unwittingly engage in all kinds of unbiblical decision-making and behaviour. In short, they are not armed to take a decidedly biblical stand against the onslaught of unbiblical thinking and attitudes that face them throughout their day (The FULL Armour of God Eph. 6:11).

Discernment intersects the Christian life at every point on a daily basis. And God's Word provides us with the needed discernment about every issue of life. According to Peter, God:

"Has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence" (2 Peter 1:3).

It is important that Christians study the Word and learn discernment from the source that God has provided for us - His Word! Without this personal study, Christians are falling prey to the false teachers and:

"Tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine" (Ephesians 4:14).

Assuming that all believers automatically have discernment is a

teaching and a deception actively promoted by the father of lies to further lead the church astray. This teaching stops believers from actively checking all they are taught; they can then be deceived to the point of becoming an ineffectual witness to the truth.

There are many genuinely saved believers in the world, but the allowance of deception removes their testimony of the truth. They are no longer an effective witness because they teach deceptions leading others astray and even into relationship with a false christ.

1Ti 4:16 Give attention to yourself and to the doctrine; continue in them, for doing this; you will both deliver yourself and those hearing you.

If it was not important that we understand correctly we would not have a warning like this. "You will both deliver yourself and those hearing you". As believers WE CAN be led astray if we are not careful. No one likes to admit that they may be wrong in their doctrine or understanding of the truth, but who among us has it all correct and knows all – no one. At all times in our studies we have to be prepared to change our thoughts on certain issues we have been taught; "renewing your minds".

If we consider study, the listening of tapes by our favourite minister or televangelist, and discussion with Christians who believe the same as us, then the believer has no concept of the meaning "Study to show thyself

approved, rightly discerning the word of truth". (2 Timothy 2:15)

Study is picking up the Bible, spending time in prayer asking the God for understanding by His Spirit and discernment in your study, and then reading it for yourself. Not just reading but stopping to think about what you have just read; meditate on it. Also listen to some other people you would not normally listen to, you may learn something. It may be that they are either deceivers, or bringing truth you had not heard because of the circles you move in. Don't be afraid to test the spirits by listening to a variety of teachers, but once you find some teachers and groups are speaking lies and deceit, have no more to do with them.

In the same vein, Pastors are equally liable, not only to deception by stringent adherence to certain teachers and stubborn indignation toward others who bring constructive criticism, but also, they are unaware of what the majority of the flock believe. In any given congregation there will be adherents to replacement theology, emergent church, faith and prosperity to name but a few. However the Pastors are unaware of these issues because 1) they are not addressed 2) it is assumed that because people are in the congregation they think the same as he does – rightly or wrongly and 3) He is unaware of the importance of knowing about these issues and dealing with them.

I have had many teachers say to me that because they only focus on

teaching the truth of scripture, those in the congregation will come to see the truth. This belief however is very damaging as the truth of Scripture also covers the issues of discernment and false teaching and how it needs to be dealt with. Not knowing the stance of the flock and allowing these deceptions to run unchecked in the background can undermine the truth of the Gospel and ultimately lead to the downfall or split of the fellowship.

Meditating

Meditating on the Word means; *does this Scripture actually mean what I have been told it means or is it out of context by what I was told? Or how do I have to change to come in line with God's Word.*



Remember Scripture supports Scripture, if it does not then it is either our lack of understanding or a supposition or possibly a personal interpretation:

Knowing this first that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation. (2 Peter 1:20 KJV)

With a thorough individual study, with prayer, you begin to see a larger picture than the limited scope taught in most churches. Many teachers have pet subjects and the bulk of their ministry will revolve around these favourite teachings and teachers. I am not saying all teaching in church is bad or that all taught is deception, but having an overall understanding of Scripture from

our own personal studies help us to see deception and context twisting when it occurs.

We must remember, that no matter how much respect for the person teaching we have, no matter how powerful a speaker he is and no matter how charismatic and large his congregation; he may not be as correct as we would like to think in his theology. I say this with the greatest respect for teachers and preachers, but we must also be aware of the dangers inherent in accepting the word from the front as gospel truth when in fact it may not be.

Remember, there are many denominations with diametrically opposed teachings within them, so somewhere, something is wrong. Simple logic will demonstrate this, let alone the warnings in scripture². So, how do we know who to listen to and how do we discern for ourselves?

Well that is the purpose of this course, not only to demonstrate the need for discernment but to help the believer gain an overall perspective of scripture that will allow for clarity and wisdom in tackling this often ignored and sometimes difficult subject.

² Luke 11:17 - But he, knowing their thoughts, said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and a divided household falls.

Comfort Zones

Another issue to consider is that we all have comfort zones, and when someone is catering to those comfort zones it makes us feel good. When we say *"it sits right with my spirit so it must be right"*, what we are saying to ourselves many times, without realising it is: *"it makes me comfortable because it pleases my comfort zone"*. In effect: we are denying Scripture and saying we know better because it feels good. This is dangerous; we must test all things against scripture and test the accuracy of what we hear.



We cannot go by feeling but the Word of God which is all truth. When we hear Scripture that we do not *like* *"it doesn't sit right with our spirit"*, that is the time we usually start questioning and even rejecting without further study. I am suggesting that we should question what feels bad as well as what feels right with our spirit. In reality however, it may be the thing we don't like that are right and the things we do like that are wrong. Those things that do not feel good or right with your spirit may in fact be the Holy Spirit prompting a change and a break away from the comfort zone. **Test Everything.**

Being taken out of our happy place always makes us uncomfortable but Jesus never promised us an easy ride, we have to DIE to SELF, not fit Scripture into the lifestyle we prefer. DIE to Self is not an acronym for *Doing It Easily*. No,

Satan through his ministers has firmly established doctrines in the Christian church that make us feel good but lead to destruction because they deny the very truth of our Lord and Saviour and promises He made and lifestyle He demands of us.

And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. So it is no surprise if his servants, also, disguise themselves as servants of righteousness. Their end will correspond to their deeds.

(2Co 11:14-15)

It is also important to mention that these ministers of Satan, in most cases, may not know that is what they are. They will fervently believe what they are teaching and truly believe they are saved and in a relationship with the Messiah. However, the unshakable and frightening truth is:

"Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord!' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven, only those who do what my Father in heaven wants. On that Day, many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord! Didn't we prophesy in your name? Didn't we expel demons in your name? Didn't we perform many miracles in your name?' Then I will tell them to their faces, 'I never knew you! Get away from me, you workers of lawlessness!' (Mat 7:21-23 CJB)

This type of lack in discernment is what has led church goers into an experiential Christianity. One that not only tickles the ears with promises made to make us feel good and feed our self-esteem, but they also cater to our need to feel something, to have an

experience we can talk about to others and feel special for having. Not necessarily consciously but certainly on a subconscious level. Going back to my earlier testimony should make one aware of the dangers of seeking an experience above truth.

“Satan comes as an angel of light, seeking whom he may devour” and he never slacks in his attempts to deceive – even the elect. Therefore it is of the utmost importance to remember that anything you are taught, especially if it is experience or self-promoting or building us up to a higher position than we deserve – be wary. Remember, we are to be humble, servants and a light to others. Not show off experience receivers who are better than others because of the experiences we have had or continue to have.

Adonai says:

Make a test of yourselves, if you are in the faith; make certain of yourselves.

Or are you not conscious in yourselves that Jesus Christ is in you, if you are truly Christ's? (2 Co 13:5 BBE)

And sadly as a result of not being discerning – the sheep are asleep.

Types of Deceptions

The different types of deceptions and understanding their origins will reveal the true depth of many of the deceptions that have infiltrated the body of



Messiah and this is where we hope to bring illumination through this course.

Now you can understand the reasoning behind the course I hope and pray that as you progress and study you will develop a real desire to serve the Messiah with zeal and the ability to confront the lies of the *father of lies* in the church and as a result, stand against them.

All our goals collectively should be the desire to lead the deceived back into the important position of righteousness and salvation in the eyes of Adonai. Helping others to become true disciples, with knowledge and equipped with a hunger for the truth and a relationship with the Messiah that glorifies God in our everyday walk and sharing with others.

Let's work together with Adonai to create a bible based, righteous walking, and light shining beacon to the truth. Becoming a beacon of light and truth to the nations!
